Hear petitions for reduction of value corrected under ORS 311.208.

Hear petitions for waiver of penalties for late filing of real or personal property returns.

Petitions must be postmarked no later than December 31, 2016 or emailed no later than 11:59PM on December 31, 2016.

The board will meet in Room 111 (lowest level) of the Douglas County Courthouse in the city of Roseburg.

A schedule of hearings for those who request to be present will be posted 48 hours prior to the meeting(s) on the Bulletin Board, 2nd Floor, Douglas County Courthouse.

Executive sessions may be held during the session as authorized by ORS 192.660, to consider documents and information made confidential under ORS 308.290(10), ORS 308.411, and ORS 308.413.

All other hearings will be scheduled as time allows. If you have requested to be present at the hearing you will be notified of the time and place to appear. Contact the Board of Property Tax Appeals Clerk for further information.

It shall be the duty of the persons interested to appear at the time and place appointed.
