9.04.010 Firearm defined. As used in this chapter, "firearm" means any weapon, by whatever name known, which is designed to expel a projectile by the action of black powder, smokeless powder or other propellant. (Ord. 86-2-1 §2, 1986)

9.04.020 Discharge of firearm prohibited. No person shall fire or discharge any firearm in the area described as all of that unincorporated area depicted on the map marked "Exhibit A," attached to the ordinance codified in this chapter, a copy of which is on file in the office of the County Clerk. (Ord. 86-2-1 §1, 1986)

9.04.030 Exception for peace officer. This chapter shall not apply to discharge of firearms by peace officers in the performance of their duties. (Ord. 86-2-1 §3, 1986)

9.04.040 Exception for self-defense. This chapter shall not apply to discharge of firearms by any person in self-defense or defense of another person or premises. (Ord. 86-2-1 §4, 1986)

9.04.050 Exception for protection from vermin, pests or predatory animals. This chapter shall not apply to discharge of firearms to protect property from vermin, pests, or predatory animals. (Ord. 86-2-1 §5, 1986)

9.04.060 Provisions not to allow acts prohibited by law. This chapter shall not be construed to allow any act that is prohibited by the laws of the state. (Ord. 86-2-1 §6, 1986)

9.04.070 Violation deemed a nuisance--Abatement. Any act in violation of this chapter shall be deemed a nuisance and may be enjoined, abated or removed. (Ord. 86-2-1 §8, 1986)

9.04.080 Violation--Penalty. Any violation of any provision of this chapter is punishable upon conviction by:

A. A fine of not more than one hundred dollars for each day of violation where the offense is a continuing offense, but such fine may not exceed one thousand dollars;

B. A fine of not more than one hundred dollars where the offense is not a continuing offense. (Ord. 86-2-1 §7, 1986)
