### GALESVILLE PROJECT AND WILDLIFE AREAS

12.16.010 Definitions. Unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the following words, terms and phrases shall mean:

- A. "Director" means the Douglas County Water Resources Director or designee.
- B. "Galesville Project Area" means all land between County Road #36, also known as Upper Cow Creek Road and Cow Creek from a point 300 yards downstream from the Galesville Dam to a point 250 yards upstream from the non-motorized boat ramp in the Galesville Reservoir. The Galesville Project Area shall also include all land within 200 horizontal feet of the southern shore mean high water line of the Galesville Reservoir. The Galesville Project Area does not include Chief Miwaleta County Park or Galesville Wildlife Area.
- C. "Galesville Wildlife Area" means that area within the Galesville Reservoir beginning at a point 2 miles east of the Galesville Dam to a point 250 yards east of the nonmotorized boat ramp. The Galesville Wildlife Area shall also include:
  - 1. All land adjacent to that portion of the reservoir pool in the Galesville Wildlife Area within 200 horizontal feet of the southern shore mean high water line.
  - 2. All land between County Road #36 also known as Upper Cow Creek Road and that portion of the reservoir pool in the Galesville Wildlife Area.
- D. "Wildlife" means wild birds, amphibians, reptiles and wild mammals. (Ord. 87-7-2 §1, 1987)

12.16.020 Creation of Galesville Wildlife Area. The Galesville Wildlife Area is created in the area defined in §12.16.010 for the purpose of protecting, conserving, and improving wildlife and wildlife habitat. In so far as it serves this purpose this area shall be left in its natural state and the natural succession of plants shall be allowed to occur. (Ord. 87-7-2 §2, 1987)

12.16.030 Prohibited Acts in the Galesville Project Area. It shall be unlawful for any person to commit any of the following acts in the Galesville Project Area:

- A. To disregard, deface, remove, tamper or damage any sign or notice posted or erected by the Director or at his direction;
- B. To start or permit a campfire or other open fire during the months of June through September;
- C. To camp in areas not designated for overnight camping;
- D. To discharge any firearm except for shotguns during waterfowl hunting season;
- E. To cut down or injure any tree without approval of the Director;
- F. To operate or park a motor vehicle, as defined in ORS 801.360, or trailer outside designated areas.

12.16.040 Prohibited Acts in the Galesville Wildlife Area: It shall be unlawful for any person to commit any of the following acts in the Galesville Wildlife Area:

- A. All acts described in Section 12.16.030 of this ordinance.
- B. To cut down or injure any tree, snag, fallen tree or log or shrubbery within the reservoir pool without prior approval of the Director.
- C. To disturb or damage any wildlife habitat without prior approval of the Director.
- D. To harass, damage or kill any wildlife without prior approval of the Director, except that waterfowl may be killed during waterfowl hunting season, if killed in accordance with waterfowl hunting laws. (Ord. 90-2-1, 1990)
- E. To violate any rule of the State Marine Board.
- F. To start or permit a campfire or other open fire. (Ord. 87-7-2 §3, 1987; Ord. 87-9-2 §1, 1987)
- G. To discharge any firearm except for shotguns during waterfowl hunting season. (Ord. 90-2-1, 1990)

12.16.050 Penalties. A violation of any provision of Section 12.16.030 and 12.16.040 of this ordinance is punishable upon conviction by:

- A. A fine of not more than \$100.00 for each day of violation where the offense is a continuing offense, but such fine may not exceed \$1,000.00;
- B. A fine of not more than \$500.00 where the offense is not a continuing offense. (Ord. 87-7-2 §3, 1987)
