PARKING RESTRICTIONS ADJACENT TO THE FAIRGROUNDS

10.05.010 Adoption of Regulations. Pursuant to Douglas County Board of Commissioners Order dated July 2, 1999, designating portions of Kendall Street and Portland Avenue adjacent to the Douglas County Fairgrounds as no parking areas during times of peak Fairgrounds parking usage, the county hereby adopts regulations to enforce such parking restrictions. (Ord. 99-7-1, 1999)

10.05.020 Delegation of Authority to Post and Remove No Parking Signs. The Fairgrounds Manager is hereby authorized to direct that No Parking signs be posted along those portions of Kendall Street and Portland Avenue referred to in the aforementioned Board Order dated July 2, 1999. The Fairgrounds Manager is also authorized to direct that the No Parking signs be removed when they are no longer needed to protect the property of the residents of those streets from overflow Fairground parking. (Ord. 99-7-1, 1999)

10.05.030 Parking Prohibited. When the No Parking signs have been posted at the direction of the Fairgrounds Manager, no person shall park a vehicle along the posted portions of the Kendall Street and Portland Avenue roadway, nor shall any registered owner of a vehicle allow his or her vehicle to be parked along those portions of Kendall Street and Portland Avenue when the No Parking signs have been posted. For purposes of this section, evidence that the vehicle was parked in the posted No Parking zone is prima facie evidence that the registered owner allowed the vehicle to be parked in violation of this ordinance. 10.05.040 Violation - Penalty. Any violation of any provision of this chapter is punishable upon conviction by a fine of \$50.00 per occurrence. (Ord. 99-7-1, 1999)
